NEWS FLASH! Incoming chair nomination



The EASA executive is pleased to announce that it has received the following nomination for INCOMING CHAIR for 2013 for Professor Ronel Ferreira. A short bio follows:

Professor Ronél Ferreira is head of the Department of Educational Psychology, as well as theme leader of the Institute for Food, Nutrition and Well-being, at the University of Pretoria. Her current research focus areas are psychosocial support within the context of vulnerability, psychological well-being of children and communities, HIV&AIDS, asset-based psychosocial coping, and the use of action

research in intervention studies that could facilitate community development and well-being. Ronél is involved in various research projects, some of which involve international affiliations. She has authored/co-authored over 20 journal articles, one scholarly book and 13 chapters in scholarly books; and has supervised/co-supervised almost 30 students to completion of their studies. Her research accomplishments are signified, amongst others, by being a rated researcher at the South African National Research Foundation and recipient of the Samuel Henry Prince Dissertation Award of the International Sociological Association (2009), the University of Pretoria Young Researcher Award (2009) and the Education Association of South Africa (EASA) Young Researcher Award (2007).

BELATED CONGRATULATIONS TO PROF YUSEF WAGHID for the NRF award for research capacity development that he received earlier this year – due to a technical glitch this news was omitted from our June newsletter. Champion of Research Capacity Development at South African Higher Education Institutions Award



Professor Yusef Waghid is a Professor of Philosophy of Education and Dean of the Faculty of Education at the University of Stellenbosch (SU). Prof Waghid is a consummate scholar whose passion for teaching has successfully supported 31 students to complete their Master's and Doctoral Studies by having established opportunities to present papers at conferences, and by offering students bursaries from his research fund. He has furthermore co-authored and published articles with a number of students. Of the 12 students he currently supervises, 11 PhD candidates are from disadvantaged communities and working within the ambit of his democratic citizenship education research focus. His deliberate engagement with students of designated groups can most appropriately be illustrated in his

2006paper Reclaiming Freedom and Friendship Through Postgraduate Students Supervision, published in Teaching in Higher Education.


