

A joint call by the World Education Research Association (WERA), the International Association for the Evaluation of the Educational Achievement (IEA), and the Research Centre "Literacy in Diversity Settings (LiDS) at the University of Hamburg.

Purpose of the Award (Why the Award):

This award enables visiting researchers to develop their own research project while benefiting from the individual support of experts from the partner institutes working in different fields related to international large-scale assessments, especially with a focus on diversity in education. The awardee will be privileged with direct access to data and resources of the partner institutes in carrying out their research projects.

Who can apply?

Early-stage researchers and experienced researchers engaged in educational research from all nationalities are welcome to apply. All applicants must hold minimum masters or an equivalent degree.

How to apply

- Please provide the following documents:
- Letter of request, including, the general objectives of your visit, and the specific activities you would like to focus on.

Your CV with a record of publications (if applicable).

A proposal or research protocol referring to the focus of your visit. This proposal must

Include the following items: Summary; Objectives; Literature review; Data; Methods, and

expected results.

The proposal must not exceed 2,000 words and must be written in English.

Closing date

The deadline for your applications is June 1st, 2022. All applications are reviewed by an

academic committee of the partner institutes. Candidates will be notified of acceptance or

rejection within eight weeks of the deadline. Please be assured that the information sent by

you is used only for the internal review process and will not be passed on to any third party.

8. Webinar Series for Early Career Academics and Postgraduate Students

The second EASA webinar took place on the 22nd of November 2021. The webinar was presented by Prof Linda Theron of the Department of Educational Psychology, University of Pretoria.

Professor Linda Theron is an Educational Psychologist and Full Professor in the Department of Educational Psychology, University of Pretoria, South Africa. Her clinical and research interest is in child and adolescent resilience, with a niche focus on how situational and cultural context nuance the

multisystemic resources that matter most for the resilience of young people from chronically disadvantaged South African communities. She currently leads/co-leads multi-year resilience studies with sites in South Africa, India, Canada, and Russia, and has authored 100+ peer-reviewed publications about child and youth resilience. The National Research Foundation of South Africa rated Linda's resilience- focused work as internationally acclaimed and she is an elected member of the Academy of Science, South Africa (ASSAf).

The title of Prof Theron's presentation was "The research funding game: Playing to win". The webinar was well attended by EASA members and other invited guests. It was an interactive session with valuable insights on the processes involved in research funding applications. The comments and feedback from the participants attest to the value of the session.

In 2022, the focus of the webinar series will be on school-based interventions and support for teachers.
