




It is noteworthy that the recipients of EASA awards over the past three years also received their physical awards during the award ceremony at the conference. Congratulations to everyone!



keynote speakers and the titles of their presentations were as follows:


- Prof Thulisile Madonsela Social Justice, Fragility and Education



















2022 EASA AWARDS

The following honours were awarded during the conference. We included the 2020, 2021 and 2022 awards in this newsletter, since they were not included in the previous editions.




2020

Research Medal winner: Prof C van der Westhuizen

Christo Van der Westhuizen, PhD is currently a Professor in Learning Technologies in Technologies in the Department of Sciences and Technology Education at the Faculty of Education of the University of Johannesburg. He is an NRF-rated researcher in the field of 'ICTs in active, blended learning environments to foster self-directed learning' with application in different subject fields, primarily Geography Education, Computer Science Education, Engineering Graphics and Design Education, etc.

Current research projects and publications include: (1) Optimizing the community of inquiry's presences in online self-directed teaching and learning environments; (2) Fostering aspects of self-directed learning in teacher training through inquiry-based learning, personalized and adaptive instruction design, the integration of machine learning, learning analytics, and virtual & augmented reality.

He has been working in the field of teacher education for the past 22 years. He is an Editorial Board member of the Journal of Geography in Higher Education (JGHE). ORCID 0000-0002-4762-8538.





Postgraduate medal: Master's – Mr TK Sebotsa and Mrs Erika Potgieter

My name is Tswakae Sebotsa, recipient of a postgraduate master's medal from the Education Association of South Africa (EASA). I am thirty-three years of age, for which twelve years have been committed to science education which is prevalent of two years in operational and strategic management, and leadership role at the University of Pretoria Pre-University Academy (UP-PUA). I am a former Physical and Natural Sciences lecturer at North-West University. As a Senior Programme and STEAM coordinator of the UP-PUA, I have assisted in developing and implementing a curriculum that intends to articulate and address the gaps between high schools and institutions of higher learning, and consequently addressing the 'elephant in the room', access and success in institutions of higher learning. I have experience in the enterprise of teaching Mathematics & Physics at the school & University level, research & community engagement. My research niche encompasses (a) the epistemological border-crossing between western science, indigenous knowledge (IK) & the arts, (b)the affordances of IK in the science classroom, & (3) students' and teachers' STEAM professional development. I attended a course on Aesthetic Education Immersion at the Lincoln Centre in New York to explore the role of arts in the Natural Sciences. I also contributed to book chapters and conference proceedings and obtained M. Ed in Physical Sciences education cum laude. The Teachers without Borders project in which I was involved got nominated in the "Science Oscars"- the project was a finalist, in the NSTF-South-32 awards.


I am **Erika Potgieter** – hallo. There is a need to think beyond 'why we teach how we teach, why learners learn how they learn'. What comes next? A critical question to think beyond the human. Therefore, my research is nested within the posthuman condition concerning Mathematics Education. I endeavour to address the question, "what comes next?", concerning engagement with research in Mathematics Education by "plugging-in" theory into data, back into theory in the sense of a (post) qualitative inquiry.



Postgraduate medal: PhD – Dr Sameera Ayob-Essop

I am **Dr Sameera Ayob-Essop**, I am currently employed at the Halton District School Board in Canada as an Educational Psychologist. I am registered with the College of Psychologists Ontario and the Health Professions Council of South Africa. My experience includes being a lecturer at the University of Pretoria and having a private practice since 2016, focusing on psycho-educational assessments, therapeutic intervention, and family counselling.

My research interest includes specialised interventional strategies to support the educational, emotional, social and physical needs of students in school settings. I completed my PhD study in 2020 and was honoured with the EASA postgraduate medal in 2021. I am an executive member at EASA, serving in the International Collaboration and Postgraduate Student Involvement position. My role is to contribute to this fine association to promote a space where individuals can have access to a wide array of skills, knowledge and lasting education success.





Emerging Researcher award: Prof Stephen Malatji and Dr Isabel Tarling

Prof Khashane Stephen Malatji holds a PhD in Education: Curriculum and Instructional Studies from the University of Fort Hare. He also holds a Postgraduate Diploma in Higher Education for Academic Developers from Rhodes University. Prof Malatji is currently an Associate Professor at the University of South Africa in the College of Graduate Studies. He is the author of 74 articles in accredited journals. Prof Malatji has successfully supervised 21 Masters' (7 with cum laude) and 19 Doctoral students. In 2018, he was awarded Young Researcher of the Year by Tshwane University of Technology. In 2020 academic year, he received an award as Emerging Researcher of the year awarded by EASA. In 2021, he received an award as Senior Researcher of the year by TUT. Prof Malatji has delivered papers and chaired sessions at many national and international conferences. His research interest covers teaching and learning; evaluation of teaching, curriculum development; assessment; and teacher development in higher education.


Dr Tarling is an ICT Integration specialist, holds a PhD in Education Technologies and Teacher Professional Development from UCT, and is the director of Limina's learning design division. Her extensive experience working with teachers from all phases, subjects and backgrounds, directly impacts the hands-on and change-driven teacher professional development courses she develops. In 2019 she was selected by the UNESCO chair at the Josef Stefan Institute, Slovenia, to create an online course for teachers as part of the Open Education for a Better World program. As an author, she is widely published and her research on teacher change is included in the National Professional Development Framework for Digital Learning. In July 2020 her adaption of the book, Teachers Discovering Computers: Integrating Technology in the South African Classroom, was published for teachers and teaching students. Dr Tarling passionately believes that the key to transforming teaching and learning lies in empowering all educators to create and innovate with technologies and to plan and manage change. This belief drives her to inspire all those in education to create and innovate with technologies, and to inspire others to do the same. Her research interests focus on Technology Integration in Discipline Specific areas, design thinking and developing socially embedded transformative programmes to support community-based innovation.

Research medal winner: Prof Elize du Plessis

Elize du Plessis holds a DEd and has 34 years of experience in distance teaching. She is a full professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instructional studies at the University of South Africa (Unisa) and is involved in curriculum development in its School of Teacher Education. Her field of specialisation is curriculum development, teaching and learning and distance education. Elize is currently the programme coordinator of the Post Graduate Certificate in Education programme (Senior Phase and Further Education and Training). She is an experienced developer of course material for student teachers. She has made contri-





butions to several books and a variety of journals and presented papers at both national and international conferences. She published more than 50 journal articles. Elize is also a national and international reviewer for several academic journals and acts as supervisor for MEd and DEd students.

Postgraduate medal: PhD – Marisa Verster and Anitia Lubbe

Dr Marisa Verster is currently a lecturer at the Faculty of Education at North-West University. Her main research focus is on curriculum studies, self-directed learning and teachers' professional development. She recently completed her PhD, which focused on enhancing teachers' curriculum as praxis from a self-directed learning capability approach. She has presented papers and published at the national and international levels, and she also acts as a co-supervisor for postgraduate students. She is participating in research projects and contributing to community service.

Anitia Lubbe has been working in the field of teacher education since 2011 as a Life Sciences lecturer at the Faculty of Education at the NWU, and her research niche encompasses assessment, assessment literacy, cooperative learning and self-directed learning. She is the subarea leader for the Assessment to support the SDL subarea of the Research Unit Self-Directed Learning at North-West University. Her PhD, entitled 'Cooperative learning-oriented assessment: Implications for students' assessment literacy and self-directedness in learning', is an amalgamation of her research interests in cooperative learning, assessment and self-directed learning. She has published at the national level, presented papers at the international level, and acts as supervisor for postgraduate students. She also co-edited a recent AOSIS publication in the NWU SDL Series (Learning through assessment: An approach towards self-directed learning). A pragmatist by heart, she is relentless in her quest to bring about assessment change within the Higher Education context. She is currently also part of research projects with a specific focus on assessment practices that enhance students' self-directed learning, as well as the affordances of self-directed multimodal assessment.



Medal of Honour: Prof Micheal van Wyk

Micheal van Wyk is a Full Professor in Economics Education, NRF-rated flipped instructional designer, and Chair of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, School for Teacher Education, College of Education, University of South Africa (UNISA). He is a qualified professional teacher, teaching both in primary and secondary schools. He had more than 18 years of teaching, research, and supervision experience at Higher Education Institutions. He published 89 articles in Web of Science, SCOPUS, DOAJ, DHET, and IBSS journals, supervised doctoral and master's degree students, read conference papers, published conference proceedings, and published edited academic books and chapters in academic books. He is a flipped instructional designer researcher in ODeL research. He was awarded for his educational contributions to Economics Education in teacher education, the Chancellor Award for Excellence in Research









(2013), University of South Africa. In 2018, he was awarded the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) for his groundbreaking research on the e-Portfolio as an alternative assessment approach in teacher education at both the College of Education and the University of South Africa. One of his recent articles entitled, Students' Perceptions of the Flipped Classroom Pedagogy in an Open Distance e-Learning University (2020), was published in Ubiquitous Learning: An International Journal (SCOPUS) and voted as the best scholarly publication by the journal vetting panel and was consequently awarded the International Award for Excellence for Research (2020), Common Ground Research Network, University of Chicago, USA. In 2023, he was awarded the Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Research, University of South Africa. Currently, serving on international journal editorial boards and vetting panels. He is the Associate Editor for Heliyon: Education, a Scopus - Open Access journal (Elsevier). His research interests are digital pedagogies, artificial intelligence, social media tools for the classroom, flipped pedagogy, ePortfolios, and Economics Education.

Research medal winner: Prof Pierre du Plessis

Pierre du Plessis is a professor in the Department of Educational Leadership and Management at UJ with a special interest in Education Leadership, Financial Management, and Education Law. Before joining the University of Johannesburg in 2002, he was a teacher for 22 years, of which 8 years as principal. He also serves as IDSO (inspector of Education) for 3 years. His research focuses on leadership and Educational Law issues, and he serves on the Executive Board of EDUTEL. He was instrumental in establishing the Education African Roundtable where academics from all over Africa share their research. Recently his focus was also on the field of education and the challenges of rural schools.


Additional foci include the expansion of school leadership and coaching school leaders with a focus on teaching and learning. He has written books on teaching and learning, marketing in schools as well as financial management in schools. He has published many papers in his field of interest. He is also rated by the NRF.

Postgraduate medal: PhD – Dr Mpho-Entle Modise

Mpho-Entle Modise (PhD) is a lecturer in the Department of Curriculum and Instructional Studies, College of Education at the University of South Africa. Mpho-Entle's research areas include faculty and student support in distance education, e-learning, open distance e-learning (ODeL), academic professional development, educational technology integration and adoption, and the use of e-portfolios in teaching and learning. She also has an interest in MOOCs and OERs.

Mpho-Entle is also a member of the South Africa Education Research Association (SAERA) executive committee, where she represents the needs and interests of Early Career Researchers (ECRs) in South Africa and other African countries.

She is the winner of the 2023 UNISA Women in Research Emerging Researcher Award for Excellence in Research. She also received prestigious Doctoral Awards for outstanding thesis from SAERA and EASA.


Emerging researcher award: Dr Eugene Machimana

Currently, he is the Head: Cirriculum Community Engagement at the University of Pretoria (UP), Department for Education Innovation.

Previously he worked as Student Advisor with Rural Education Access Programme (REAP) in 2004 to 2006. From 2007 to 2009 he worked at Equal Opportunity Foundation (EOF) in Cape Town. He joined the University of Pretoria's (UP) Faculty of Veterinary Science in 2010 as their Community Engagement Coordinator. In 2017, he was appointed as a Senior Lecturer and Faculty Community Engagement Chairperson. In 2018 he joined the Department for Education Innovation, Unit for Community Engagement, as a Senior Education Consultant: Community Engagement. 




NETWORKS OF EXPERTISE



Substance of yhe WERA Invitational Symposia:


EASA has to take the lead in organising a research symposium of high quality and merit with whomever they wish to work with in the Association. These symposia are an opportunity to feature key research in our country or region. A symposium provides opportunities, not afforded by a single paper, to examine a specific education research problem or topic through an international, comparative, or worldwide lens and to bring to bear diverse perspectives, intensive discussion, or a wide range of expertise.

Format of WERA Invitational Symposia:

The format must follow the same guidelines and provide the required fields for symposia as depicted in the Call for submissions for the WERA 2023 Focal Meeting (in Singapore, as discussed above).

Invitational Symposium proposals are submitted by an organiser who may or may not be a chair, presenter, or discussant. A WERA symposium includes a chair and discussant and between three and five participants. Participants include all presenters and any discussants. The symposium can include presenters from other countries or regions – although this is not obligatory.

Please do not invite each other (across Associations) to participate in these symposia.



Submission of WERA Invitational Symposia:

Invitational Symposia will not go through the process of review that open submissions do in response to the WERA 2023 Focal Meeting Call. As the quality assurance is already screened by the relevant WERA Association member submitting the session.

- Invitational Symposia must be submitted ONLY between 1 August 2023 and 1 September 2023.


