CALL FOR PAPERS

Oral paper presentations, symposiums, workshops, round table discussions and poster presentations are the formats of presentation at the EASA 2024 Conference. There is a possibility that virtual presentations will be accepted (please indicate if you are interested in presenting your presentation online).

Presentations within the following themes are invited for presentation at the conference:

Conference themes

Neurodiversity and social justice in Education

This sub-theme focuses on the promotion of better understanding of neurodiversity and its role in addressing social justice in education. The sub-theme invites presentations from neuroeducation, neurology, neuroscience, neurochemistry, neuropsychology, developmental neurobiology, developmental neurobiology, neuro-philosophy with special emphasis on Autism Spectrum Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD), Epilepsy, and Learning Differences and Specific Learning Disorders such as Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dyspraxia and other neurodevelopmental challenges.

ICT's and the 4IR Educational landscape

The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted the educational landscape around the world. The disruption led to the ICTs and the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) playing a pivotal role in education for the advancement and evolution of humanity. This sub-theme creates opportunities to showcase the critical and innovative ways of using the ICTs and the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) for teaching and learning. Within the context of neurodiversity, research based on ICTs and the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) lead the way towards understanding innovations such as neuroimaging and others.

The SDG's for Education

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a compass for the enhancement of humanity. This subtheme showcases implementation of the SDGs in education. While SDG 4: Quality Education is central to understanding the space of the SDGs in education, it is imperative that to establish the articulation of those related to education such as Health and Well-being, Gender Equality, Decent Work and Economic Growth, especially for neurodiverse populations. As the world is ever-changing and becoming complex, quality education must forecast the future of education.

Trauma and School violence/ school safety

This theme deals with issues that compromise the quality of education in the 21st century. Trauma and school violence shake the foundations of our education systems. Trauma in Schools has many sources. Some school traditions may appear harmless on the face value, but could have traumatising effects on learners and educators. School violence compromises school safety and effective teaching and learning. Presentations on these themes could encourage peaceful means to the future of education beyond 2030.

Lifelong learning and Resilience in Education

The cradle enhances learning that started in situ. Lifelong learning provides the pursuit of learning from the cradle. While they may be transitioning challenges, lifelong learning presents valuable lessons for resilience in education. This theme focuses on individual continuous re-skilling for employability and personal as well as professional development. Competencies and skill-gaps are fertile ground for open distance learning to add to prior knowledge for a specific 21st century skills. The competitiveness of education requires learners to develop skill that help them to resile through today's turbulent education systems. Despite many uncertainties, resilience is the capacity to adapt well within the ever-changing education systems. This theme invites innovative ways that can promote resilience in education amidst chaos and demotivation.

Community partnerships through engaged scholarship

The future of education greatly depends on community partnerships that can be developed through engaged scholarship. Community partnerships can become the conscience of education systems. Education transformation and decolonisation could find responses for betterment of communities through engaged scholarship. The theme invites presentations from community members who partner with education systems. An invitation for educational renaissance through learning from indigenous knowledge systems is highly encouraged. Action research-based case studies of engaged scholarship are recommended.

Future-fit leadership in education

The changing education landscape requires a mindset of leading in a changing world. Future-fit leaders need to unlearn old ways for leadership in order to embrace adaptive intelligence. The theme unpacks the importance of culture in leadership. Future-fit leadership enhances effectively responding to constantly evolving threats and opportunities in education and the labour market. Papers are invited to demonstrate future-fit leaders who create a shared sense of purpose, be a change agent and be inspirational.

Ethical considerations in the landscape of education

Ethical considerations in education create safe spaces for research conduct and human relations between learners and educators. The theme must challenge the current issues regarding ethics in education. Issues such as the ethics surrounding the use of ChatGPT in education, the use of paraphrasing tools and gamification as methods of teaching. The prevalence of AI in promoting plagiarism.

GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS

Proposals for presentation of papers at the EASA 2024 conference will be

- in the form of a 200-to-300-word abstract with
- a clear title of the presentation,
- author/s of the paper,
- an indication of the theme within which the paper should be considered and
- contact details of submitting presenter.
- Each delegate may only present a maximum of 2 papers.
- Abstract proposals will be considered on a continual basis.
- A detailed programme will be announced once it has been finalised.
- Only abstracts of delegates who paid the conference fee before **30 November 2023** will be included in the programme.

Delegates need to submit proof of payment on or before the due date, to ensure inclusion of their abstract in the Book of Abstracts and attendance/presentation at the conference.
